Abstract Format Details

- Abstracts should be no more than 250 words
- The submitting author will be asked to categorize their abstract based on the topics listed above, or "other".
- The submitting author is obliged to ascertain that all authors are aware of the content of the abstract before submission.
- Abstract titles should be brief (maximum 100 characters) and reflect the content of the abstract. Do not use capital letters in the title except for words that are always capitalized and do not use non-standard abbreviations.
- Abstracts should be structured in such a way as to include (1) Purpose; (2) Material and Methods; (3) Results; (4) Conclusions.

- Please refrain from using references in the abstract. If references must be used, please use sequential numerical notation in the text as superscript. Please do not use linked field codes (such as those produced by Endnote).
- The use of standard abbreviations is desirable. A special or unusual abbreviation must be placed (in round brackets) after the first appearance of the word for which it stands.
- We prefer the use of a 'standard' font, preferably 12-point Arial. For Mathematical symbols, Greek letter and other special characters, use normal text or Symbol font. Word Equation Editor/MathType should be used only for formula that cannot be produced using normal text or Symbol font.
- All abstracts are to be submitted in Word format (.doc, .docx). Please include your title in sentence case and authors (including institution and country) in your Word document.
- Authors may include one data table in the body of the abstract in JPG format (this is not included in the number of characters).
- Authors may include one image in JPG format. The maximum file size of each image should be 500 KB. The maximum pixel size of the image is 600(w) x 800(h) pixel.
